Trophy History

In late 1996, Bill Jolley, an F-31 sailor from Niceville, Florida, expressed a desire to support multihull sailing through U. S. SAILING and created the Hoyt-Jolley Foundation to provide perpetual funding to Multihull Championships.

Sailed in a variety of multihulls, the U. S. Youth Multihull Championship derived from U. S. SAILING's Fast and Fun program developed and ably led by Art Stevens. In 2001, the first championship was sailed at Spray Beach Yacht Club in Beach Haven, N. J. In 2002, the championship was hosted by the Port Clinton Yacht Club, in Port Clinton, Ohio. In 2003, the championship moved to the Fort Walton Yacht Club, in Fort Walton Beach, Florida. This year, the Hoyt-Jolley Trophy was renamed the Arthur J. Stevens Trophy, in recognition of the efforts of Art Stevens, former Chairman of the Multihull Council, in developing youth multihull sailing in the United States.

In 2004, the U. S. Youth Multihull Championship will be sailed in Hobie 16s; hosted by the Sea Cliff Yacht Club, Sea Cliff, NY. It is an ISAF qualifier for the Youth Worlds that will be held in South Korea in 2005.
